## Noble police investigate train, pedestrian collision

NORMAN — Noble police and investigators with the State Medical Examiner's Office are working to identify a man hit by a train Monday night near Cemetery Road.

Noble Police Chief Keith Springstead said the accident happened about 10:30 p.m. on the railroad tracks north of Cemetery Road. The man died at the scene.

"The medical examiner was called and came to the scene," Springstead said.

He said nobody else was hurt.

Police believe the victim is about 30 years old and lived in the Noble area, Springstead said. Officers do not know if the man was standing or sitting on the tracks when he was hit.

Springstead said he didn't know which direction the Burlington North Santa Fe train was headed when it collided with the man. The body was taken to the State Medical Examiner's office in Oklahoma City.

State Medical Examiner's Office spokeswoman Cherokee Ballard said pathologists performed an autopsy on the body Tuesday afternoon.
